FIV+ and FeLV+ Felines – We have an entire room dedicated to their care and adopted out 40.

PAWSitive Recovery – Through our collaboration, we provided 1,200 days of care for cats whose owners were seeking substance abuse treatment or recovering from domestic abuse, giving cats a soft place to land until they can be reunited with their owners.

Results

Elective Procedures – In addition to spays/neuters and vaccinations, we performed 37 dental services for cats in our care and owned pets in financially challenged homes as well as 14 other surgeries to improve health outcomes and longevity.





Dusty's Story:

Dusty was brought to RMFR from Texas after being thrown out of a moving car, resulting in the loss of his tail and distrust of humans.

Although it took some time for Dusty to begin to trust again, eventually he settled into shelter life, spending his days exploring the cat yard and observing the action from high perches.

Dusty needed to be the only pet and didn't do well with kids. He was an overstimulation case and needed a special home with someone who would take it slow.

After 499 days in our care, Dusty found his person and is now blossoming into a relaxed and happy cat in his fur-ever home.

- Provide continuing education opportunities for staff
- Obtain analyzers for our lab so that we can obtain faster results and begin treatment sooner
- Begin a program to care for and rehome cats of those who passed away
